**U.S. Department of Energy Advisory Board
Conducting Membership Recruitment Drive**

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is currently seeking members from rural communities in southern Nevada for its community-based advisory board. The Nevada Site Specific Advisory Board (NSSAB) is comprised of rural and urban community members who provide recommendations to the DOE Environmental Management Nevada Program regarding environmental cleanup activities at the Nevada National Security Site (NNSS).

NSSAB members typically meet every other month and provide recommendations from a community perspective on radioactive waste disposal and transportation activities, the effects of historic nuclear testing on the groundwater at the NNSS, budget, and other environmental remediation activities.

“As a Board member, your opinions are a valued part of discussions that lead to recommendations affecting our communities. This is one of the few ways that citizens can actually be agents of change and is a truly rewarding endeavor,” said Frank Bonesteel, chair of the NSSAB.
