NEVADA NATIONAL SECURITY SITE LAUNCHES NEW WEBSITE AT NNSS.GOV

LAS VEGAS – The Nevada National Security Site (NNSS) has launched a brand new website on Sept. 1, 2016, NNSS.gov, hailing the programs and people that perform important national security work in defense of our nation. The (.gov) website is a first for the NNSS, and is similar to the websites featured at other government organizations such as the National Laboratories.

NNSS.gov replaces the previous nv.energy.gov website. The new site features all the latest news as well as information on all NNSS programs and facilities.

“The NNSS has been working toward building a 21st century workforce, and creating a new look and image for the NNSS is an important step in that direction,” said Darwin Morgan, NNSS director of the Office of Public Affairs. “NNSS.gov streamlines information about our facility while also offering video, photos and other resources that promote the mission of the Site.”

The Nevada National Security Site has a rich and storied history. Located 65 miles north of Las Vegas, the NNSS also has locations in Livermore and Santa Barbara, Calif., Los Alamos and Albuquerque, NM, and Maryland. The Site provides support to the National Laboratories in carrying out stockpile stewardship science. Numerous global security programs also enhance the country’s abilities to protect against terrorism threats.

The NNSS unveiled a new logo this summer, and the look and the feel of NNSS.gov coincides with the change. Visitors to the website can navigate between information on NFO and its contractors, find jobs, request photographs or guest speakers, or basic history and information in the current mission of the site. In the upcoming weeks, NNSS.gov will increase the number of videos available on the Site about mission and programs. Plans are also underway to make the site compatible with mobile devices. All of these efforts are designed to provide a clearer, more concise look at the work carried out at the NNSS.
